CHAPTER XVII MUNICIPAL FIRE-BRIGADE

285. Maintenance of firemen and of necessary fire engines, etc.

Maintenance of (1) With a view to the discharge by the Corporation of the duty of firemen and of

extinguishing fire and protecting life and property in case of fire, the necessary fire

Commissioner shall provide, in the statement of municipal officers engines, etc

and servants from time to time prepared by him under section 51, for a force of firemen, with a proper number of officers over them to be called "the municipal fire-brigade", and shall furnish the said brigade with all such fire-engines, fire-escapes, vehicles, accourtements, tools, implements and means of intercommunication as may be necessary for the efficient discharge of their duties.

- (2) A person may be appointed to be a member of the fire-brigade m addition to any other office or employment of such person.
- (3) The Corporation may recognise any body of persons on such terms and conditions as it may fix as a volunteer fire-brigade to supplement the municipal fire-brigade.

286. Powers of Chief Officer of Fire -Brigade at a fire.

Powers of Chief

On the occasion of a fire the Chief or other officer in charger of the Officer of Fire-Brigade at a firefire-brigade may, subject to such orders as the Commissioner may

from time to time issue in this behalf, take the command of all municipal officers and servants present and of any other persons who voluntarily place their services at his disposal; and may on such occasions exercise all or any of the powers specified in the rules.

 $\mbox{(1) It shall be the duty of all police officers and of all municipal {\bf fire-brigade}}$

officers and servants to aid the fire-brigade in the execution of their duties.

(2) Any police officer or any municipal officer may close any street in or near which a fire is burning and remove any persons who interfere by their presence with the operations of the fire-brigade.

(2) No damages shall be payable for any act done in good faith by any person in any operations carried out in pursuance of section 286 or 287.

289. Report of fire to be submitted.

Report of fire to be A report of every fire which occurs in the City shall be submitted by submitted

the chief or other officer in charge of the fire-brigade not later than the day following the fire to the Commissioner, who shall make such further inquiry, if any, as he may deem necessary and shall furnish a weekly return of all fires which occur in the City to the Standing Committee.
